

- ensure good outcomes for the children


The next Nurture Group Network meeting will be held on Tuesday 30th April from 4pm to 5pm at Pickhurst Infant School.

Last summer, Bromley Council made a bid to be part of the Government's new wave of Free Special Schools. The Secretary of State has now accepted our bid and we are progressing to the next stage of the process – the trust competition stage.


We are holding an event to enable potential bidders to find out more about our vision for a Multi-Agency Centre of Excellence that has a world class primary Free Special School at its core.

## SEND Engagement Framework

Engagement of children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities, and their families, is one of our strategic priorities in Bromley for 2018-19 - and it remains a priority in the extended strategy for 2019 to 2022.

Engagement will form part of the Local Area SEND Inspection from Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC).



It is important that we continue to build the momentum of this work and that we have a good overview of all the engagement activity which is taking place by collating the key messages and outcomes which emerge.

The Council, NHS Bromley Clinical Commissioning Group and Bromley Parent Voice have coproduced our SEND Engagement Framework 'Inform, Involve, Influence'.

This framework is for everyone and provides practical information to be used by professionals, families, children and young people to ensure that together we achieve the best possible outcomes for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities in Bromley.

## Who's who in SEND?

I manage the team of Educational Psychologists in Bromley who specialise in developmental, educational and child psychology. We work with schools, young people and parents to help understand a child's situation and respond to their special educational needs to maximise their potential and outcomes.

We cover from birth up to the age of 25 but most of our work is with early years and school age children.

We also provide training, consultation and interventions for schools and support the London Borough of Bromley around it's statutory processes and in understanding how to meet the needs of children.

We are a traded and relatively small service (which means schools have to choose to purchase our service) so do not take direct referrals from parents, but most schools do opt to buy us in. If a parent feels that input from our service would be helpful they should contact their child's school.

# SEND Mythbuster

#### Myth -

"Every child with special educational needs is entitled to £6,000 worth of individual support"

#### Fact -

Schools have a budget to support children with special educational needs, this is referred to as the notional budget. This money is used to support children with SEN throughout the school by enabling them to access a range of interventions (both individual and group) and strategies to help them access their learning.

Schools use their SEN notional funding across the whole of the school to make provision for all children and young people who need extra help. The support can take many forms - some children and young people will need less help and some may need more and the vast majority will need support that comes to much less than  $\pounds$ 6,000.
