

• There will be one consistent person working with child or young person and their family,

throughout the statutory assessment and annual review processes. If there is more than one child or young person with an EHC Plan, the same EHCP Coordinator will work with the

There will be no change of EHCP Coordinator when a child or young person changes school

• Families will only need to tell us their story once and the EHCP Coordinator will be able to work closely with them, guiding families through each stage of the process. They will be the

We will be making these changes over the next few months and have planned carefully in order to reduce any disruption as much as possible. Any EHC Needs Assessment that is currently in process and any annual reviews already underway will remain with the current EHCP Coordinator. Once
