Mayor of Bromley 2021-2022

Councillor Russell L. Mellor, of Copers Cope ward was elected Mayor of Bromley for the current year, at the Annual Meeting in May. The Mayor has been a resident of Beckenham since 1962, living in the Copers Cope Ward for which he has been an active Councillor since 1998. The Mayor is a Freeman of the City of London. He is also a Freeman of the Worshipful Company of Stationers and Newspaper Makers and a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Distillers.

Deputy Mayor of Bromley 2021-2022

Councillor Tony Owen of Petts Wood and Knoll was elected Deputy Mayor of Bromley for the current year, at the Annual Meeting in May. The Deputy Mayor was elected to Petts Wood & Knoll ward in Bromley in 1989. He has been a member of many council committees. When chairman of the General Purposes & Licensing committee, he was the architect of the council's licensing policy.

The Mayor welcomes the news that tens of thousands of residents have been vaccinated, including almost 100,000 vaccinations at the Civic Centre alone.

Armed Forces Day

The Mayor led Bromley Council's annual flag raising ceremony on Thursday 24th June, to mark the week running up to Armed Forces Day celebrated on Saturday 26th June 2021. The service was livestreamed so that residents across the borough could watch from the safety of their own homes.

Due to current restrictions we are only able to have limited guests attend the flag raising service, but I still want residents to have the opportunity to join us in our recognition of the men and women who make up the Armed Forces Community." Mayor's Civic Service

The Mayor held his Civic Service on Sunday 27th June where prayers were said for the Mayoral year. The service was conducted by the Mayor's Chaplain, Reverend Canon Jeremy Blunden and was held at St George's Parish Church in Beckenham. Although numbers were limited due to the restrictions at that time, the service was well attended and memorable.



Mayor's Charities

The Mayor has chosen two very worthwhile charities to support throughout his Mayoral year: The Shipwrecked Mariners Society and The Beckenham Parochial Charity.



The Beckenham Parochial Charity

The Beckenham Parochial Charity, BPC, is an amalgam of seven historical charities which continues to help people living in Beckenham and Penge by providing housing (almshouses), making financial grants for promoting the education of children and young adults in need and making financial grants to people suffering hardship or distress.

BPC owns six almshouses in Beckenham and has a long lease on three bungalows in West Wickham. They are small properties for single occupancy and the charity is responsible for their maintenance and upkeep.

BPC is also able to offer grants to assist individual students and schools in a variety of ways such as financial help so children from low income families can go on school trips, help towards the cost of clothing and equipment, financial help for extracurricular activities, the costs of suits for interviews, university books and IT equipment.

Financial grants are available to alleviate financial need causing hardship or distress. These are in the form of a direct payment for the purchase of items, services or facilities. Recent examples include grants to buy washing machines and cookers, a cover for a mobility scooter, a computer for a charity and help for families or individuals overwhelmed by financial problems.

The Shipwrecked Mariners Society

The Shipwrecked Mariners' Society is a national charity which provides financial support to merchant seafarers, fishermen and their dependants who are in need. As an island nation, 95% of our trade volume arrives by sea; as such we remain highly reliant on the sea and those who serve on it.

The Society was established in 1839, initially to look after those affected by the regular shipwrecks which took place along our coastline, but over time our role has evolved to support those whose lives become metaphorically 'shipwrecked'. We pay an immediate grant to the surviving partner of a serving seafarer who dies, whether death occurs at sea or ashore. Regular grants are paid to former seafarers or their partners, whose circumstances justify on-going support. Special grants are made to meet particular needs in crisis situations, or to help with funeral costs.


