2011 Census: Second address estimates for local authorities in England and Wales

Published 22 October 2012

These tables are part of the first release of second address estimates from the 2011 Census of Population for England and Wales.

The release provides information for England and Wales and constituent regions, London boroughs, districts and unitary authorities as at census day, 27 March 2011. The estimates included are the number of usual residents in England and Wales who reported having second addresses outside of the local authority or region in which they were usually resident.

It includes information about:

people who live at a second address within a local authority (or region) for at least 30 days per year, but who were usually resident in a different local authority (or region) in England and Wales; and

people who were usually resident in a local authority (or region), but who also live at a second address in a different local authority (or region) for at least 30 days per year.

The figures are provided in four tables with information for each local and unitary authority (in Tables 1 and 2) and for each region (in Tables 3 and 4), these tables are classified by sex, broad age group and type of second address.

A further four tables (Table 1a - 4a) provide similar information expressed as rates - these are defined as the number of people with a second address per 1,000 usual residents. These four tables are classified only by type of second address.

This release is in accordance with the provisions of section 4(1) of the Census Act 1920.

Confidentiality

ONS as the executive arm of the UK Statistics Authority has a legal obligation not to reveal information collected in confidence in the census about individual people and households. The confidentiality of all census results, including the counts in this release, is protected by a combination of a variety of disclosure protection measures.
