Many residents are organising street parties to celebrate His Majesty the King's coronation on 6th May and I am delighted that over 170 street parties will be taking place. This follows earlier confirmation that we are waiving all fees for the street closure orders.

The proposal by Sadiq Khan, the Mayor of London to extend the Ultra-Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) is of great concern to Bromley Council. As London's largest borough, much of which is Green Belt, our air quality is amongst the best in the Capital. Imposing a £12.50 daily charge on non-compliant vehicles with an expensive network of cameras and signs will penalise many small businesses, elderly residents on fixed incomes and those like nurses and others who work unsocial hours when public transport is not available. The Council, in conjunction with four other councils, has begun legal proceedings to try to prevent this unnecessary imposition on residents and workers. Updates on the legal case can be found on our website.

The remaining Pay and Display machines in the borough are being removed as 3G mobile signals are being switched off nationally, the machines are obsolete and spare parts are no longer made, and with most motorists paying for parking by phone, we could not justify spending £1m of council taxpayers' money to replace and operate them.



You can use any phone to pay to park, it does not have to be a smart phone. If you haven't already downloaded the RingGo app, I would encourage you to do so. Further information and advice about all of this is available on our website **bromley.gov.uk/ringgoparkingpayment** and in libraries as well.

Nature Friendly

Verges

A new, nature friendly, management regime for grass verges at 11 trial locations across the borough will encourage wild flowers and bees to flourish.

As part of the Nature Friendly Verge trial, these verges will receive one grass cut annually in the autumn and be left to grow throughout the rest of the year, with other verges being cut throughout the year as normal.

By allowing these carefully selected verges to grow, the Council expects to improve biodiversity in the borough, increase natural carbon storage and support reducing the impact of pollution. Grass verges can act as wildlife corridors connecting habitats and greenspaces, increase floral diversity and increase pollinator habitats. This is good news for bees, butterflies and invertebrates! Net Zero by 2027 Progress Update



Good progress in reducing the Council's organisational emissions to net zero is being made. The latest figures for 2021/2022 show a reduction of 9% compared to the previous year and a 51% reduction compared to the base year.

The continued upgrade of the Council's streetlights continues to reap significant financial and energy savings, contributing towards the net zero target.

Platinum Jubilee Parks Fund makes Bromley green spaces even better

What happens to my aluminium cans?

When we collect your green box along with plastics, tins and glass, it is taken to a sorting facility in the UK. From here, the aluminium is separated and:





The shredded metal is placed into a large heater and melted into a liquid



This molten metal is then poured into a mould to solidify



Once the metal is solid, it can be made into new products



The council receives regular information about where Veolia send the borough's recycling and both monitor and check the information and data supplied. Action being taken to tackle fly-tippers


Fly-tippers are being warned that as well as facing prosecution for dumping rubbish, they risk their vehicle being seized and crushed. The warning follows the most recent crushing of a vehicle a few weeks ago, where the owner was also prosecuted. The latest crackdown on fly-tippers has seen successful prosecutions, with residents also encouraged to report dumped rubbish so action can be taken.
