

RIGHT TO LIVE & WORK GUIDANCE LIST A DOCUMENTS

You must provide <u>original</u> documents from either List A or List B of acceptable documents for a manual right to work check.

If you hold EU settlement status or a Biometric immigration Document, you must provide a share code which can be obtained from https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work and a home office online right to work check will be conducted.

List A

Document	Insert √
1. A passport (current or expired) showing the holder is a British citizen	
or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK.	
Please note a clipped British or Irish passport is a cancelled document	
and therefore not acceptable proof of right to work.	
2. A passport or passport card (in either case, whether current or	
expired) showing that the holder is an Irish citizen.	
3. A document issued by the Bailiwick of Jersey, the Bailiwick of	
Guernsey or the Isle of Man, which has been verified as valid by the	
Home Office Employer Checking Service, showing that you have been	
granted unlimited leave to enter or remain under Appendix EU to the	
Jersey Immigration Rules, Appendix EU to the Immigration (Bailiwick of	
Guernsey) Rules 2008 or Appendix EU to the Isle of Man Immigration	
Rules.	
4. A <u>current</u> passport endorsed to show that you are exempt from	
immigration control, are allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, have the	
right of abode in the UK, or have no time limit on your stay in the UK.	
5. A <u>current</u> Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to	
you with an endorsement indicating that you are allowed to stay	
indefinitely in the UK or have no time limit on your stay in the UK,	
together with an official document giving your permanent National	
Insurance number and your name issued by a government agency or a	
previous employer.	
6. A long or short birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, together	
with an official document giving your permanent National Insurance	
number and your name issued by a government agency or a previous	
employer.	

- 7. A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland, together with an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name issued by a government agency or a previous employer.

 8. A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen.
- 8. A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, together with an official document giving your permanent National Insurance number and your name issued by a government agency or a previous employer.

List B Group 1

1. A <u>current</u> passport endorsed to show that you are allowed to stay in	
the UK and are currently allowed to do the type of work in question.	
2. A document issued by the Bailiwick of Jersey, the Bailiwick of	
Guernsey or the Isle of Man, which has been verified as valid by the	
Home Office Employer Checking Service, showing that you have been	
granted limited leave to enter or remain under Appendix EU to the	
Jersey Immigration Rules, Appendix EU to the Immigration (Bailiwick of	
Guernsey) Rules 2008 or Appendix EU to the Isle of Man Immigration	
Rules.	
3. A <u>current</u> immigration status document containing a photograph	
issued by the Home Office to you with a valid endorsement indicating	
that you may stay in the UK and are allowed to do the type of work in	
question, together with an official document giving your permanent	
National Insurance number and your name issued by a government	
agency or a previous employer.

1. A document issued by the Home Office showing that you have made	
an application for leave to enter or remain under Appendix EU to the	
immigration rules on or before 30 June 2021 together with a Positive	
Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.	
2. A Certificate of Application (digital or non-digital) issued by the Home	
Office showing that you have made an application for leave to enter or	
remain under Appendix EU to the immigration rules (known as the EU	
Settlement Scheme), on or after 1 July 2021, together with a Positive	
Verification Notice from the Home Office Employer Checking Service.	
2. A document issued by the Bailiwick of Jersey or the Bailiwick of	
Guernsey, showing that you have made an application for leave to enter	
or remain under Appendix EU to the Jersey Immigration Rules or	
Appendix EU to the Immigration (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Rules 2008 on	
or before 30 June 2021 together with a Positive Verification Notice from	
the Home Office Employer Checking Service.	
4. An application registration card issued by the Home Office stating that	
you are permitted to take the employment in question, together with a
