Failed Application Redress

Please contact The London Borough of Bromley in the first instance. If you wish to appeal against a decision you may appeal to the local Magistrates court within 21 days of the notice of the decision.

Consumer Complaint

If that has not worked, if you are located in the UK, <u>Consumer Direct</u> will give you advice. From outside the UK contact the <u>UK European Consumer Centre</u>.
