A report with the proposed Policy was presented to the Council's Care Services Policy Development and Scrutiny Committee on Wednesday 21 January 2015. The report included a recommendation for the Council to agree to undertake a period of engagement with members of the public and key organisations in Bromley on the proposed Policy. The Strategic & Business Support Services division ran the engagement activity for the Adult Social Care Services and Finance Management divisions. The purpose of the engagement activity was to seek the views of service users, their families and key organisations in the borough on the proposed changes to the Disability Related Expenses element of the Non-Residential Contribution Policy. The respondees were also asked for their views on the other charging changes that result from the Care Act – including the 'arrangement fee', 'charging for carers' and 'backdating charges' - to support the implementation of the new policy from 6 April 2015. The engagement activity ran from Thursday 29 January until Wednesday 25 February 2015, and consisted of: a) A hardcopy survey and supporting fact sheet sent to 2,000 people who are currently receiving a service from the Council b) An easy read version of the survey and supporting fact sheet sent to 399 people who are currently receiving a service from the Council who have a learning disability c) An online survey promoted via the Bromley MyLife website and via some of the Council's ley partners in their newsletters (such as Bromley MeLife website and via some of the Council's ley partners in their newsletters (such as Bromley MeLife website and via the Bromley MyLife website and

	 In total there were 283 responses to the survey – including both the standard version (219 responses) and the Easy Read version (64 versions). The survey was sent to 2,399 people – including both the standard version (2,000 people) and the Easy Read version (399 people).
