	Of the thirty-three London Boroughs, twenty-eight have outsourced this function to the Post Office and five manage the scheme in house. LBB currently manages in house with a combination of manual and computerised processes the current system is not sustainable does not meet reporting requirements and there would be significant costs to developing a stand alone system (800k).					
	The best option currently is for LBB to enter the Post Office Tfl LC agreement whereby Freedom Passes for older people will be issued via posts offices and post office staff ( any post office in london) as opposed to 7 LBB locations with LBB agency staff

During the renewal period of 8 weeks Feb to Mar 55000 people aged 60+ need access to issue points. There should not be negative impact on any particular groups as access will improve. Access hours will increase 1900 per week as against 150 per week. More data will be available and comparable to other boroughs including take up and where given, ethnicity within take up.		I
