To develop a multi-agency approach that ensures young carers receive the appropriate level of assessment and support to enable them to achieve the five outcomes of Every Child Matters.

- To develop a protocol for joined up working between children's services and adults' services and between children's services and schools

- To offer a carers assessment to all young carers meeting the eligibility criteria

		Young carers on the Carers Bromley database range from 4 to 18 years old with an average age of 12. 198 female young carers and 179 male young carers as at 14 <sup>th</sup> August
		Of the 375 young carers on the database, 268 are White British with the next largest majorities being 'Black/Black British- Caribbean' (21); 'White-other' (19); and 'Mixed-other' (17).
		Carers Bromley employs a Community Development Worker to go out into other communities and raise awareness about Carers Bromley's services. The worker works particularly with Somali communities but also aims to find out about other minority communities and makes referrals where necessary.

Defining a young carer clearly	Expert advice	Advice was sought from an LBB Educational Psychologist with regards to a lower age limit for young carers. This proved a very blurry and contentious area. However, based on the development of a child's abstract and emotional thought, it was considered that the lower age limit should be 8 years old with exceptions permissible in certain circumstances.
<ul> <li>Develop information packs (organise content material)</li> </ul>	Staff discussions between Carers Bromley and CYP	A template for LBB's information pack was designed based on Carers Bromley's established but outdated information pack. Permission was obtained from Carers Bromley to use certain aspects of their information pack and best practice was shared as to what should be included and excluded from the pack.
		The back cover of the information pack lists approximately 10 other languages which the pack can be translated into on request. This information will also be made available on the website.
<ul> <li>Disseminating information packs across multi- agencies</li> </ul>	Discussions with the Bromley Gypsy / Traveller Project	Discussions with the Project Worker for the Traveller Project informed us that the information pack would not be the best way of communicating with this community as there is a high level of illiteracy. Word of mouth was described as the most effective method of communication. Another suggestion for successful partnership working was to

• Develop young carers protocols between ACS and CSC and between schools and CSC and healthcare and CSC	Staff discussions	recruit a specialist worker (ideally from the Gypsy Traveller community) who could build up trust and reassure the rest of the community, explaining the services available to young carers in a non-pressurised way. Expert advice was sought from the Head of Access and Admissions for schools regarding the protocol between CSC and schools. A protocol between ACS and CYP is being developed by the Policy Officer in CSC. The protocol for young carers between CSC and ACS will be fed into this with a link to the document provided.
