Searching for the record of a burial

Introduction

Burial registers are kept to record when and where a person's remains are buried. They usually contain information including the person's name, their burial plot and the date of the burial.

There are <u>nine cemeteries and one crematorium</u> in the London Borough of Bromley as well as numerous churchyards.

What information do I need before I start?

To increase your chances of a successful search try to find out:

- the name of the person
- their date of death
- their place of death/last known address
- their religion.

Which records can I see at Bromley Local Studies and Archives?

We have been designated as a Diocesan Record Office for the Dioceses of Rochester and Southwark. As a result we hold some burial registers of those Church of England parishes which fall within the London Borough of Bromley.

Burial registers are transferred to us once they are no longer in use by the parish. If we do not hold a burial register, it may still be in the custody of the parish.

Not every Church of England parish has a churchyard. Often a service would be performed at the church and the burial made in a civil cemetery. We do not hold the burial records of burials made in civil cemeteries.

Are your records indexed?

We hold indexes for many of the burial registers that we hold, as well as some indexes of registers that are still in the custody of their creating parish. Please see the end of this guide for a detailed list of the indexes that we hold.

Top Tip!

If there is a last known address for the individual (perhaps from the death certificate) locate the address on a map. It may be possible to find alternative cemeteries or churchyards to the one which was presumed as most likely. However, check to see if the cemetery would have been open when the individual was buried.

Top Tip!

Death notices and/or obituaries which may have been published in the local newspapers may reveal details of where the burial took place. Microfilm copies of local newspapers can be accessed in the Local Studies Library.
