Searching for the record of a marriage

Introduction

Marriage registers are kept to record when and where a couple was married. They usually contain information including the names of the couple, the occupations of the couple, the names of their fathers, the occupations of their fathers, the date of their marriage and the signatures of two witnesses.

What information do I need before I start?

To increase your chances of a successful search try to find out:

- the names of the couple
- their dates of birth
- their date of marriage
- their place of birth
- their address(es) at the time of the marriage
- their religions.

Which records can I see at Bromley Local Studies and Archives?

We have been designated as a Diocesan Record Office for the Dioceses of Rochester and Southwark. As a result we hold some marriage registers from those Church of England parishes which fall within the London Borough of Bromley.

Marriage registers are transferred to us once they are no longer in use by the parish. If we do not hold a marriage register, it may still be in the custody of the parish.

Are your records indexed?

We hold indexes for many of the marriage registers that we hold, as well as some indexes of registers that are still in the custody of their creating parish.

Please see the end of this guide for a detailed list of the indexes that we hold.

What is the General Register Office marriage index?

The General Register Office (GRO) index all marriages that occur within England and Wales. The GRO index can be used to search for basic information about a marriage. That information can then be used to order a copy marriage certificate from the General Register Office.

We hold a copy of the GRO index on microfiche in Local Studies for marriages that occurred between July 1837 and 1996. The index is also



available to search through a number of family history websites including ancestrylibrary and freebmd which can be accessed in Local Studies using the Public Network computers.

Which records are available elsewhere?

Records of marriages made in churches and civil premises as well as records of civil partnerships are available through the General Register Office.
